City Spirit in Las Vegas, a city-wide arts planning project funded by National En-downment for the Arts, City of Las Vegas, Diamonds (through the Dayton Hudson Foundation) and CETA, has announced plans to conduct a public survey on cultural arts activities, facilities and users' patterns. The planned telephone and personal survey will be prepared and directed by the Research Division of the College of Arts and Letters at UNLV. Complimenting the community part-nership theme of City Spirit, the Las Vegas Jr. League will collaborate with City Spirit Coalition in this phase of the 1-year planning study, which focuses on the cultural needs of West Las Vegas while broadening the role of the arts in the entire Las Vegas Valley.
