John H. Johnson, publisher, businessman and humanitarian of Chicago, has been named to the International Executive Committee of Here's Life, planned as the most extensive Christian social and evangelization mission

in recorded history.

His appointment was announced by Wallace E. Johnson, co-founder, director and member of the executive committee of Holiday Inns, who serves as International Chairman of Here's Life, a communication program des-igned "to share with every person on earth the teachings and love of Jesus Christ." Its first year goal is to raise \$100 million in cash and pledges.

Objective of the five-year Here's Life pro-

gram, Wallace Johnson said, is to introduce basic ongoing ministries of evangelism and discipleship into every nation and protectorate of the world, support these ministries with the deployment of thousands of men and women working at their own vocations in foreign countries while assisting churches in evangerlism and social action, and use saturation discipleship and evangelism materials and techniques in cooperation with national churches and other Christian organizations.

These concepts, he said, are the creation of Campus Crusade for Christ International, headed by William Bright, founder and president.

A FRESH HISTORICAL

A review of The Free and The Unfree: A New History of the United States (Penguin Books, N.Y.) 448 pagespaperback, \$4.95.

There is nothing novel about "fresh perspectives" on history. Every young historian knows better, so he or she believes, than those who taught or preceded them.

This newly-released book is an excellent text, although those who seek in it some earth-shattering new revelations will be disappointed. It is more of a factual treatise, carefully arranged, than a fresh philosophical approach to the meaning of our all-too-poorly perceived traditional pictures of America's past.

This reticence to give un-bridled praise to this fine work of scholarship stems from a long-manifest need for a thoughtful re-writing of American history complete with "warts and all."

For young people and for the general public, looking for this cosmic event of the "great day for history in America," this book is not an answer.

Yet it is a workmanlike production useable for a ready reference and thoroughly worthy of consideration for introductory collegiate and advanced high school textbook use
