


During the recent Sixth Grade Center Fes-

VA Advice

Some veterans and dependents may be needlessly failing to receive benefits they are entitled to because they can't locate formal documents which reflect marriage and child dependency relationships.

The Vetarans Administration tells veterans and their dependents that the loss of marriage or birth certificates and other important documents should not keep them from seek-

ing benefits.

The original documents are important and they should be protected, but they are not absolutely necessary to establish entitlement

absolutely necessary to establish entitlement to veterans' and dependents' benefits.

For example, VA will accept a certified statement instead of an orginal birth or marriage certificate to establish eligibility provided it is the first marriage for each partner and VA has no contradictory information on file.

In the past, VA policy required formal documentation to support claims for compensation and education benefits for veterans, widows and orphaned children.

Now, VA will accept a certified statement regarding the birth of a veteran's child or as proof of age and relationship in disability cases.

Veterans and their dependents who have eligibility questions should contact their nearest VA office or a representative of one of the national service organizations for assistance.
