Assemblyman Bennett Seeks Re-Election


Assemblyman Marion Bennett, a three-term member of the Nevada legislature, announced today he will seek relection as represen-

tative of Assembly District 6.

Bennett, the pastor of Zion United Methodist Church since 1960, was chairman of the Special Commeittee on Tourism and Economic Development during the 1977 legislature. He served as chairman of the Assembly Committee on Health and Welfare in 1973 and 1975. He was vice chairman of that committee in 1977 and a member of the Labor and Management Committee and Legislative Fuctions Committee.

Bennett said his priorities for the 1979 session would be legislation to assist senior citizens with utility bills, reduction of property taxes, more funds for preventive programs dealing with drug abuse and mandatory insurance coverage for treatment of alcohol

and drug abuse. He successfully worked for a landlord-tenant bill and day care centers for low income working mothers during past sessions of the legislature, as well as reform and updating of criminal laws, gaming legislation defining priviliged gaming licenses and funds for increased economic development.
