and bought the basically sound buildings, replaced wiring, plumbing, floors, windows, doors, etc, installed new air & heat units, etc. and moved back in.

Then they went to the police dept, fire dept. and insurance companies and asked for more police and fire services and got them. The insurance companies re-insured and reduced rates in that particular block. Block after block were bought up and rehabilitated in this manner so those cities are being revived. In New Yourk and Chicago old run down buildings have been torn down and replaced with modern new buildings in much the same manner. New streets, sidewalks, sewers, light, etc. were installed and today those areas are considered elite areas. By making these areas desirable the cost of buying, maintaing, etc were not only reduced but the people now have decent, clean, safe areas in which to live. We can do it, too.
