NEW PREGNANCY TEST CAN BE DONE AT HOME

A do-it-yourself pregnancy test, called E.P.T. In-Home Early Pregnancy Test sold to millions of women in Europe is now available for the first time nationwide.

A major breakthrough in the field of home diagnostics, E.P.T. is sold in drug-stores without prescription. It can detect a pregnancy as early as nine days after a woman has missed a menstrual period, thus helping to assure that she will obtain the earliest possible proper prenatal care for her own health and that of her unborn child. The sooner a woman finds out she's pregnant, the sooner she can begin proper health habits, such as the avoidance or minimizing of exposure to cigarettes, alcohol, improper nutrition and some commonly used household medications, all of which can be harmful to the developing baby.

The test is safe, simple and is highly accurate. The kit contains just four parts: a test tube containing reagents used to detect a hormone called HCG; a dropper; a vial containing purified water; and a test-tube holder with mirror. To conduct the test, a woman simply collects a sample of her first morning urine and places three drops of the urine and the purified water from the plastic vial into the test tube, which already contains the test reagents. Next, she presses the rubber stopper into the test tube and shakes it vigorously for 10 seconds. She then places

the test tube back in its original position in the holder and leaves it completely undisturbed for two hours.

If after two hours a dark brown donut-shaped ring forms in the bottom of the test tube, as reflected in the mirror located beneath the test tube, the woman can be 97 percent sure she is pregnant and should consult her doctor for proper medical care.

If a negative result (no brown ring—just a yellow-red deposit) is obtained on the first test, a woman can be 80 percent sure she's not pregnant, but if menses do not begin, a second test

should be performed one week later. If still negative, the woman can be 91 percent sure she's not pregnant, but if she still doesn't get her period she should see her doctor, since there may be other important reasons for this condition.

Many doctors feel it's important that a woman take this test because the first 60 days of pregnancy are so critical in fetal development. The E.P.T. test offered by the Warner/Chilcott Division of Warner-Lambert can get mothers-to-be to their doctors nearly a month earlier than if they waited until a second period was missed, as is usually the case.
