Bring forth with thee every living thing that is with thee, of all flesh, both of fowl,


and of cattle, and of every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth; that they may breed abundantly in the earth, and be fruitful, and multiply upon the earth.

The Everlasting Gospel' The prophets of the Old Testament prophesied of the coming of our Lord, his birth and his suffering. He was called by many names and titles. They prophesied of John the Baptist Is 40:3. Joel prophesied of the Holy Spirit Is 40:3. Joel prophesied of the Holy Spirit Joel 2:28. The fist of these prophesies was: 'LOOK WHAT IS COMING.' This was not the Everlasting Gospel. John the Baptist, the first prophet of the new testament, came on the scene preaching the Gospel of Repentence and Baptizing unto the same, for the Kingdom of God was at hand. The preparation Gospel was to soften the hearts of men and make them ready to recieve and believe the Lord Jesus. Luke 3:1-20; St. John 1:6-8, 15, 37; The theme of John the Baptist preaching was 'GET READY TO RECIEVE THE GOSPEL' John the Baptist's message was an overture to the main event to come, not the Everlasting Gospel. Jesus Christ also, pre-ached the Kingdom of God is at hand, but, he went much much further in his teachings. He taught men how to BE READY TO RECIEVE THE HOLY GHOST and thus enter into the realm of the Kingdom of God.

The book of Matthew tells the story of John the Baptist and the Earth Life of Jesus. Matthew was not an apostle or prophet, he was a deciple of Jesus Christ. A portion of Matthew's writtings, which we cannot forget, are found in Matt I: 21, 23. This was not the Everlasting Gospel. The book of Mark, was written by John Mark, a deciple. In a most heavy statement, when quoted Jesus saying: and you shall be hated by all men for my name sake, found in Mark 13:13. Luke was responsible for the book of St. Luke with the greatly remembered chapter and verses 24:45 through 53. This was the winding up of the Gospel of Jesus Christ

while on Earth. The apostle John, the brother of James, both the sons of Zebedee. This John wrote the Books: I John, II John, and III John including the Book of Revealations. In this he tells us of his great vision and what he heard the angel say about the Everlasting Gospel. Apostle Paul wrote the following Epistles: Rom., I and II Corin.; Gal., Ephe,, Phili., Coll., Thess., I and II Tim., Titus., Phill., the author of Hebrews are not known.

The Epistle of James, the supposed to be brother of our Lord, Matt 4:21. This apostle was head of the first Apostlolic Church at Jerusalem. The Epistles of I and II Peter was written by the Apostle Peter.

to whom the Lord Jesus, gave the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven; Matt 16:17, 18, 19. The Epistle of Jude was written by the Apostle Jude, who is supposed to be our Lord's brother, Matt 13:55. He wrote this letter and sent it to the local churches.

The acts of the Apostles was written by Luke, who gives the hard core message of Peters ministry beginning on the day of pentecost when he, Peter, stood up and with a loud voice declared, THIS IS THAT. Peter surely had the Keys to the Kingdom and he used them to unlock the mystery of the ages. His Sermon began in Acts 2:14 and continued through the 40th verse. This was the first time the Everlasting Gospel was preached to all nations under Heaven, beginning at Jerusalem, telling the truth in the power of Gods wisdom with anthority given by the Holy

Jesus said, I have yet many things to say unto you, but you cannot bear them now, but when he, the Holy Ghost, is come, he will guide you into all truth, St John 16:12, 13. The Holy Ghost will teach you all things and bring all things to your remembrence,

The Holy Ghost was speaking through Peter as he preached on the day of Pentecost. Paul speaks out in II Cor. 4:3 saying, if our Gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost. Gal 1:8, 9. He says, but thoughwe or an angel from Heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached

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unto you, let him be accursed. About three thousand who recieved the word and were Baptized and continued steadfastly in the Apostles doctrine and fellowship Acts 2:42. The household of God, is built upon the foundation of the Apostles and prophets and Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone. Ephe 2:20.




Allen Ray Armelin
