New Book by "Jimmy Carter"

"Jimmy Carter's Odyssey To Black Africa - Part One" is the title of the new book by Africanist scholar Stan Grant, author of "The Call Of Mother Africa", the bestselling work covering the contemporary scene of Africa in the Sixties, The Emergent African Independent States and The Freedom Fighters of The Era.

Grant is currently in Miami, Florida, to finish the introductory chapters and arrange final selections from the vast array of exclusive photographs which are to be included in the book.

The author travelling to Black Africa before President Carter and his suite was in Nigeria at the time of his historic visit there and also in the Rublic of Liberia.

He revisited both Nigeria and Liberia immediately after the visit for Post Mortem of the Carter's visit and collected a vast amount of material including photographs not seen anywhere else of President Carter's effectively monumental trip to Black Africa, the first official visit by a United States president in office.

The only other visit to subsaharan Africa by a United States president was that of a plane refueling stop by President Franklin Roosevelt in 1943 at Liberia's Roberts Field enroute from Casablanca where he went to treat with Britain's wartime prime minister Sir Winston Churchill and France's Le Grand General De Gaulle.

"Jimmy Carter's Ocysey to Black Africa - Part One" is scheduled to roll off the printing press by the end of August 1978.

Project

Two New Mexico high school science teachers have been selected to participate in an industrial research laboratory work experience projece at Rockwell International's Science Center. The project is part of an innovative program aimed at increasing the number of Hispanos and American Indians entering science and engineering professions.

Announcement of the project was made jointly by Gov. Jerry Apodaca of New Mexico and Dr. Peter Cannon, Rockwell staff vice president - Research and vice president of the Science Center here.

Alex Gabaldon of Belen High School, Belen, N.M., and Edward A. Maestas of Espanola Valley High School, Fairview, N.M., were selected for the two-month project as a result of their scientific and mathematical expertise and their proven ability to inspire minorities entering science fields.

The work experience project is part of an overall effort that Rockwell and the National Institute for Professional Development (NIPD) of Albuquerque are developing to increase the interest of Hispanic and American Indian students in science and engineering careers.

Rockwell also is working with the Schools of Engineering at the University of New Mexico and New Mexico State University on related efforts. A \$60,000 grant from the National Science Foundation to support the overall program is anticipated in the near future.

Dr. Cannon said that Gabaldon and Maestas will be given the opportunity to study and develop an understanding of the advanced technology research being industrial research facilities.

"Through this exposure and training, we hope that Gabaldon and Maestas will be better equipped to motivate and stimulate their students -- a high percentage of whom are Hispanos and American Indians -- toward the choice of science and engineering as viable careers," he said.

Governor Apodaca said he welcomes the Science Center program to New Mexico, "for it addresses a very real social problem and develops a long-term strategy to correct the problem." He commended the Science Center, the National Science Foundation and the NIPD for "insight, courage and commitment" and saluted the teachers for their ability and professional integrity.

Dr. Henry Casso, president of the NIPD, said, "The attraction of top talent from Hispanic and Indian communities into scientific and engineering professions, where there is no long history of professional participation, will require innovative and untried strategies."

"The selection of two New Mexico high school science teachers with a track record of directing minorities into science and engineering is expected to have a far-reaching impact on animating more Hispanic and American Indian youth into these areas," he added.

Both Gabaldon and Maestas now are in temporary residence in Thousand Oaks for the summer program.
