Festival

A Shakespearean Festival, an international wine seminar and an advanced study of terminal illness and death are among the 150 classes being offered during the second summer session at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Registration continues through July 14 with classes starting July 17. The session runs through Aug. 18.

Students may complete registration from 8:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. each weekday. Packets may be obtained from the Registrar's Office in Frazier Hall.

Special classes and workshops include UNLV's international wine seminar, described by university officials as "quiet possibly the only class of its type offered for credit anywhere in the United States." The three-week course includes the study of fine table wines from all over the world.

Class members will be able to develop their own discriminatory tastes for different wines in several tasting sessions to be instructed by experts in wine service.

Shakespeare Buffs will travel to the internationally reputed Utah Shakespeare Festival in Cedar City. There will be seminars each day, followed by productions each evening and a critique after each performance.

This year the company is presenting Othello, Twelfth Night and a Midsummer Night's Dream.

Death and dying will be the subject of two courses during second summer session. The advanced social work seminar deals specifically with working with dying patients.

A sociology class covers social factors related to death and dying with an emphasis on managing grief and the role of the dying patient. Additional topics will be prolonging life artificially and the funeral industry.

Other special classes include a counseling seminar, child guidance, human sexuality and plant propagation. Several seminars on problems in education are available.
