



Mini Parks

Three mini park signs, bearing the names of outstanding West Las Vegans, have been completed and installed, according to H. P. Fitzgerald, Executive Director of the West-

side Community Development Commission.
The Ethel Pearson Park is located at North "D" Street and West Washington Avenue. The James A. Gay, III park is between I-15 and North "B" Street, and West Adams and West Owens Avenues. The Lubertha M. Johnson park is in Vegas Heights on the site of the one time Vegas Heights School at the intersection of Concord Street and Balzar Avenue.

Fitzgerald stated that appropriate dedication ceremonies are now being planned by

United States Department of Housing and Urban Development Block Grants Funds were used to furnish the parks with playground equipment, picnic tables, tennis courts and basketball courts, which were built in 1976. All three parks are scheduled to be equipped with toilet facilities using H.U.D. funds during the 1978-79 grant year, according to Fitz-
