SMOKEY ROBINSON

Musical great, Smokey Robinson, is joined by Patti Austin, a success as a singer of jingles and background vocals, this weekend on Soul Train's entertainment special. With over 500 musical compositions to his credit, many of them performed by other artists during his 20 year career, Smokey still continues to please with his spellbinding delivery of "Daylight & Darkness," "Trying It Again" and "Why You Wanna See My Bad Side."

Singer, composer, record producer, actor and vice president of Motown, Smokey recently produced his first movie, "Big Time" and composed the musical score.

Quincy Jones does a special introduction of Patti Austin for her Soul Train debut. From her second album of her own compositions, "Havana Candy," Patti sings "We're In Love" and "I Just Want To Know." After chalking up spectacular credits singing commercials, and as backup vocalist with such artists as Aretha Franklin, Paul Simon, Phoebe Snow, Roberta Flack and Frankie Valli, Austin has now directed her talents to live performances and records.
