Crime Prevention Program

Operation Life Community Development Corporation will introduce the community Crime Prevention Program (CCPP). The CCPP program originated in Seattle, Washington and was developed by Seattle's Law and Justice Planning Office. The program was named an Exemplary Project by the National Institute and was nominated through the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA).

Ralph White and Valora Bush have been appointed Community Project Coordinator and Project Organizer. Terri Robinson, Michelle Smith, Carl Ford, and Jerome Washington are the four youth organizers.

The program will have three major areas; community meetings, the youth conducting a questionnaire and a survey in the community. The program will reach 700 residents in the community within a nine month period. The CCP Program is designed to educate and show families how to install safety devices and measures for residential security. The CCP Program is funded by Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) and the Equal Opportunity Board.

Candidates invited to attend the meeting have assured the NAACP members they will be present to meet the NAACP members and the general public which is also urged to attend, Dr. McMillan said.

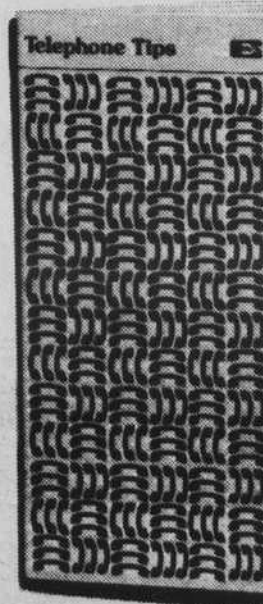
