The Seattle Sounders had three must win situations this past week in their drive to the 1978 playoffs. They won all three to qualify for the final National Conference wildcard berth and received an outstanding offensive performance from forward MICKY CAVE in the process. Cave was named OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK by the Professional Soccer Reporters Association for his game winning goal in the 3-2 win over Portland, his goal in the 2-1 Shootout victory over Oakland and his two assists in the 5-2 defeat of California.

Cave's 32 points for the season placed him 11th in the National Conference top scorers list. Last year he set a Sounder scoring record with 30 points, sixth best in the NASL. The 5-8, 155 pound forward joined the Sounders early in 1977. He led York City in the
