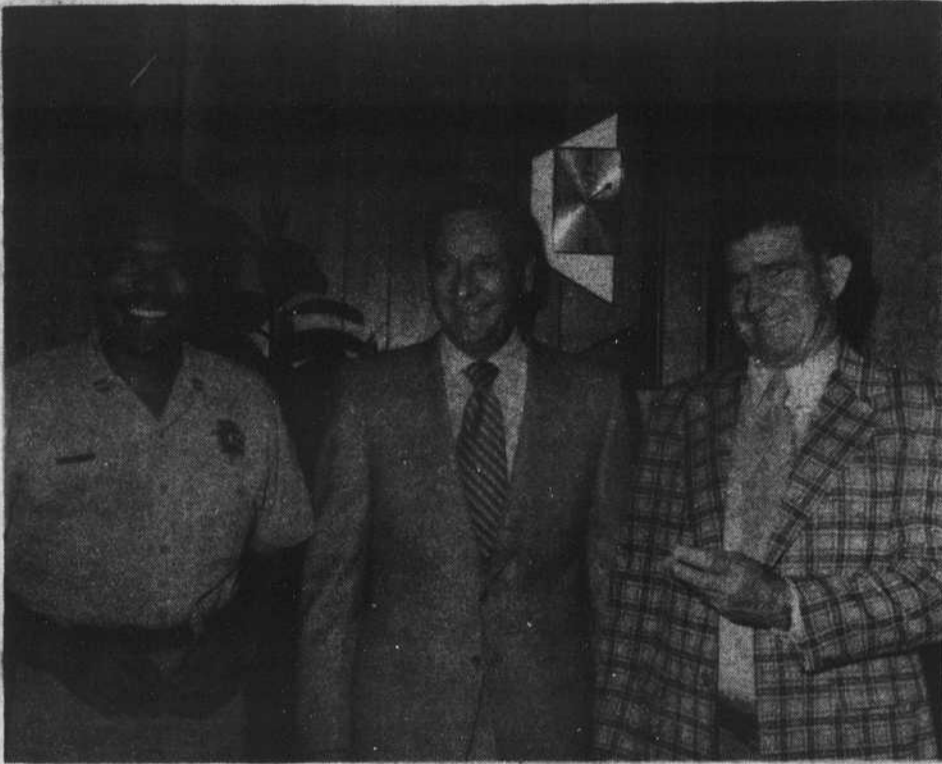


# Sheriff Ralph Lamb Presents Service Award



Capt. Larry Bolden and Sgt. Robert Behrman, both of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, were recently presented with service awards by Sheriff Ralph Lamb.

Bolden, a 20-year veteran of Metro, is presently jail commander. A graduate of the University of California at Fresno and the National FBI Academy at Quantico, Va., he has also served as station commander of the Patrol Bureau.

During his career, Bolden has been in charge of the Police Community Relations Bureau, both a sergeant and lieutenant in the Patrol Division, and has served as lieutenant in the Detective Bureau.

Sgt. Behrman began his career with Metro July 1, 1953. He is currently assigned to the Special Operations Bureau, which includes search and rescue, sheriff's jeep posse, sheriff's aereo squadron and the sheriff's underwater recovery force.

He has previously been assigned to the Pace Unit of the Las Vegas Police Department, Narcotics, Vice and the Detective Bureau. Behrman has completed special weapons training, tactical firearms training and FBI police administration courses.

His latest commendation was awarded in January by the United States Air Force for his efforts in searching for missing aircraft.
