Earth - Shaking NEWS

Predicting Quakes
Important strides in cracking open the mysteries of earthquakes and predicting them in order to save thousands of lives have recently been made by geologists.



NEW FINDINGS are leading to better earthquake prediction and the probable saving of thousands of lives.

In Japan geologists have found that the ground tilts slightly a few days before an earthquake. A Soviet Union study indicated that a change in the pattern of microearthquakes (detected only by sensitive instruments) precedes a quake. Another study suggests that controlled pumping of water into deep wells may be used to produce many small artificial tremors, releasing strain and possibly preventing major earthquakes.

The American Geological Institute says progress is being made in predicting earthquakes, the greatest of all natural disasters.

In 1976 upwards to a million people died in an earthquake in China.

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
