Sealed proposals will be received by the Dir. of the Dept. of Highways of the State of Nevada at their office in the State Highway Building, Carson City, Nevada, until and opened at 1:30 pm, local time on Dec. 14, 1978 for Contract No. 1761 Project F-995-2(5), construction of a portion of the Primary Highway System in Clark County, Nevada, on U.S. Highway 95, Expressway in Las Vegas between 0.38 mile west of Decatur Boulevard and the junction with U.S. Highway 95 (Tonopah Highway), a length of 6.197 miles.

The attention of bidders is directed to the State Contractor's License Law requirement (NRS 624.230 as amended to date), that a contractor hold a valid license of a class corresponding to the work to be done. BONELESS MEAT MAY BE MORE EXPENSIVE, but you get four servings per pound, compared to two or three from bone-in.

If you want to make some inroads on inflation, stop thinking price-per-pound, package, dozen or quart. Instead, say experts at the Food Marketing Institute, start thinking price-per-serving. The more mouths you have to feed with your food dollar the more you can save.

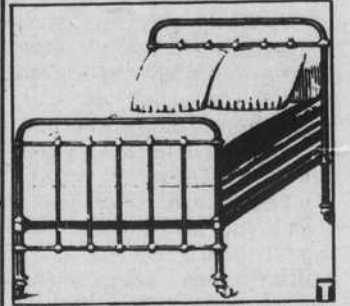
If flank steak, for example, is \$2.49 per pound, it's a better buy than spareribs at \$1.29. You'll get four servings from the pound of flank, but not much more than one per pound from the ribs.

Instant coffee costs less per cup than regular coffee. An eight-ounce jar of instant or freeze-dried coffee will give you 120 six-ounce cups of coffee—the same as two pounds of fresh roasted coffee.

However, tea bags and instant tea are more expensive than tea leaves. A pound of tea will give you 200 cups, so tea bags may cost you half again as much.
