## Black All Star Bowl Set For Jan. 7

Some 37 colleges will have at least one football player of the East and West squads of the Black College All Star Bowl here in the Superdome on the evening of January 7, according to Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett, San Francisco newspaper publisher and bowl chairman.

Grambling leads all the colleges with six placements on the East squad. Jackson State, South Carolina State, and Winston-Salem State are second with five each on the squads. And the South Western Athletic Conference (SWAC) leads the other three conferences with a total of 26 of the 82 players chosen.

Coach Willie Jeffers of South Carolina State will direct the East squad, and Coach Rudy Hubbard of Florida A&M -- National Black Football Champions -- will handle the West.

The two 41-man squads will be quartered at Southern University, Baton Rouge, La., where they will begin practicing on December 28. Scouts of 26 of the 28 National Football League teams and four Canadian teams will observe the players in practice and confer with them during their stay at Southern. It is expected that at least 30 of the all stars will go very high in the NFL draft.

The team did not arrive in the gym for the scheduled 7:30 p.m. until 7:15, but Lumberjack officials agreed to delay for the tipoff so the Dealers could dress and warmup before the game.

The bill for the two taxi cabs came to \$120, Jones said. Jones graciously kicked in a toke on top of that.
