### **IMPORTANT** FOOD STAMP CHANGES

The Food and Nutrition Service has announced that effective Jan. 1, 1979, food stamp recipients will no longer have to pay for the purchase of their food stamps.

Under the current Food Stamp Program, most households participating have been required to pay something for their food stamp allotment in order to receive the bonus amount.

Elimination of the purchase requirement means that participating households will receive only the bonus food stamps.

For those households currently certified for food stamps through January, their ATP card for January will reflect this change.

Other changes in the Food Stamp Program mandated by Federal Law are expected to be put into effect after March 1, 1979, and will be announced.

### UNDERSTANDING YOUR HOLIDAY BLUES

It happens to Mary K. every year. The wreaths, Christmas carols and giftgiving trigger painful memories and depression. As friends and family members anticipate the festivities, Mary's depression grows. The holiday season becomes a burden almost too great for her to bear.

Mary's case is not an isolated one. Psychiatrists know the number of docu-mented cases of depression rises significantly during the Christmas and New Year's period. They point to a number of reasons which explain why the holiday season is an emotional hurdle

Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's are "time machines" because they take us back to childhood feelings of hostility, resentment or insecurity. Increased time spent with family members during the holidays may cause you to dwell on these feelings, especially if your childhood memories are not happy

The absence of a family member due to death or separation is painfully obvious during this time of vear and can also result in anxiety and depression.

If you are a person who is often "down," you may be unable to cope with the pressure exerted by society to enjoy oneself during the holiday season. If your mood is not joyous, you are considered a scrooge at best. Most holiday depressions are mild enough that they do not require medical at-



tention. Positive changes in your life, such as new friendships to replace missing ones, may eliminate your blues completely. But for some the depression is severe and persistent enough to require psychiatric care and even hospitalization. Appropriate attention and pre-holiday counseling is recommended. By reaching the root of your depression, you may lead a happier and more satisfying life all year round.

Medicines, such as tranquilizers and antidepressants, have greatly enhanced treatment of severe depression. Since the introduction of these drugs in the midfifties, the number of patients confined to mental hospitals has decreased by more than half. Pharmaceutical advances help keep people out of hospitals, allowing them to continue to be active, productive members of society in spite of their illness.
