It is White Power that makes the laws, and it is violent white power in the form of armed white policemen that enforces laws with guns and nightsticks. The vast majority of Blacks who live on the Westside, live in captive communities and must endure the conditions of opression because and only because, we are Black and powerless.

Without bothering to go into the historic factors that contribute to this pattern of economic exploitation political awareness, discrimination in employment and education, one can see that to correct these patterns will require far reaching changes in the basic power, relationship and the ingrained social patterns within the society.

The question of course is: What lines of changes are necessary, and how is it possible to bring them about?

In recent years the answer to these questions has been given by most articulate groups of Blacks and their White allies, the liberals, have been in favor of something called intergration according to the advocates of intergration.

Social justice will be accomplished by intergrating the Blacks into the institutions of society hich he has been traditionally excluded It is very significant that each time I have heard this formulation it has been in terms of the Black, rather than in terms of the community.

We are on the Westside not by choice but by force, economic, employment and education. But our great White fathers forgot one thing: PUTTING US ALL TOGETHER ON THE WEST-SIDE, WE ARE A SOURCE OF POWER, A POL-ITICAL MACHINE, WE CAN MAKE OR BREAK A POLITICAN, BROTHERS AND SISTERS THE TOOLS ARE RIGHT HERE ON THE WESTSIDE. 1979 is the beginning of a new year. BUSINESS IN THE BLACK

Performance or Prison

General Bernard W. Rogers, Chief of Staff, U.S. Army, came from Kansas. General Rogers is a bit of a wizzard himself. Even looking like a Four-Star General all right enough with his steel enough being and unblinking even. Every soldsteel snow hair and unblinking eyes. Every soldier saluted this Rhodes Scholar, including the

General Rogers reasons the Russians are at least ready, possibly able and almost willing to whip U.S. ground forces in a conventional war in Europe. Black officers account for 6.1% of the Army, but Black Americans account for 28% or one out of every four foot soldiers in the chief of staff's service.

High Black American unemployment of males in the 17-25 year old range can provide cannon fodder for fighting conventional type wars. Conventional wars keep a lot of warm bodies tied up of any color until they're dead.

General Rogers reasoned in a speech to the Commonwealth Club of San Francisco, California that the Army's major contribution is in the conventional field. While he believes the active army is ready, his greatest concern is for the National Guard, Reserve and civilian employees to support a total combat effort. What the General did not say was how much higher the casualties for frontline troops, mostly black, may be if there is insufficient back up for conventional war forces.

General Rogers believes we have good men and women in the active Army. Performance is the word that pops right out of his mouth in making a soldier. Since, according to him, 83% of the Army personnel are high school graduates getting an honorable discharge would seem a goal

for the average Army guy.

But Black Americans fill more of the Army's jails than their numbers dictate to be the case. In 1972, when Black Americans made up 17% of the enlisted ranks, they constituted nearly 37% of the prisoner population on a yearly average. By 1976, Black Americans constituted more than half the prisoner population.
