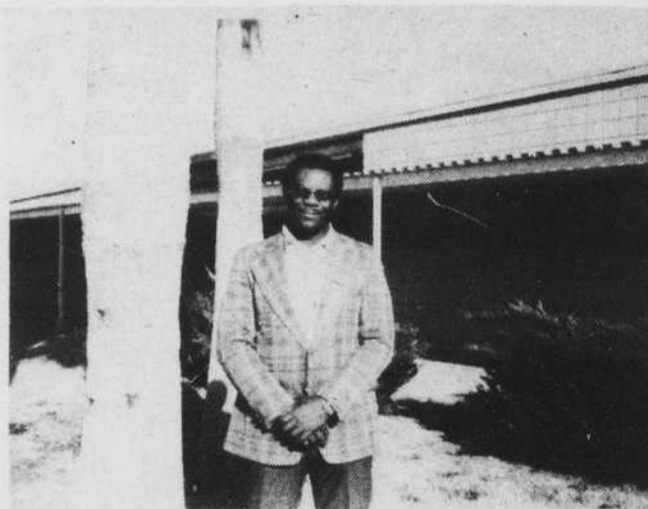
Mrs. Ana McLaughlin
