

Las Vegas version of the "Smith Brothers" offer a different kind of remedy than the cough drop made famous by their forerunning counter parts.



Their paths separated when Willie left Seminole and went to the University of Missouri where he was all big eight and All-America performer, while Sam chose to come home and assume a significant role with Jerry Tarkanian's "Running Rebels".
