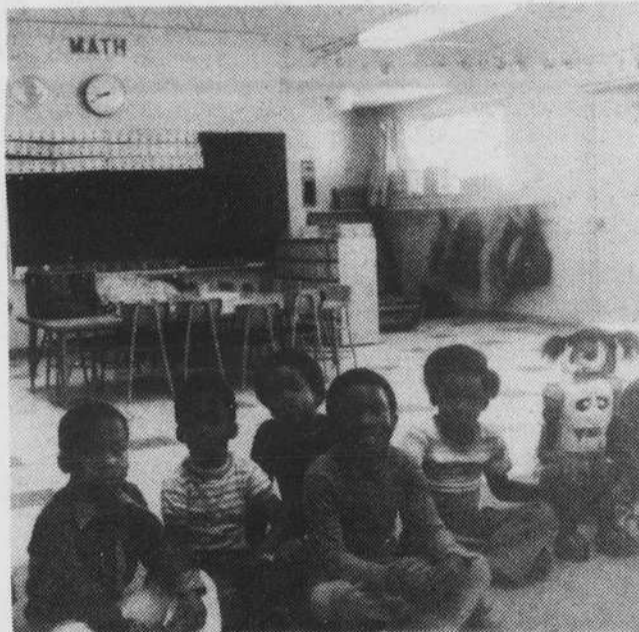
MATT KELLY SIXTH GRADE CENTER
