

limited. Guidance and caution should be the directing principles.

A good academic experience would include readings and talks about the biology of aging, the psychology of aging, the economics of later years; discussions on the problems of crime and the aging, transportation, health care, the plight of the widow, the homebound, and the lonely; panels of workers engaged in helping services to the aging; visits to seniors homes, senior centers, nutrition sites; and one to one contacts where friendship and understanding can grow.

Let's face it, we are getting older.

Education Of Blacks In America

A 16-page newspaper insert on the Black experience in America, from the first slaves in Jamestown in 1619 to the present day, will be distributed in mid-February by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith and the National Council for the Social Studies.

The supplement, titled "The Record: The Black Experience in America 1619 - 1979," will be sent out to the Black community through newspaper supplements and classroom teaching guides. It will be in tabloid form.

This special project is being coordinated with the American Broadcasting Company's 14-hour production of "Roots II: The Next Generations," telecast February 18 through February 25 on the ABC-TV network.

The supplement will document -- through letters, news reports and firsthand accounts -- the history of the Black community in America and the struggle for racial justice.

Archive drawings and photographs illustrate the Black experience from slavery to the present day. The tabloid also features a chronology of events, a TV viewer's guide for the "Roots II" broadcast with questions for discussion, and a bibliography for further study of the subject.

The front page of the paper features a dramatic photo of the 1963 March on Washington led by Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. With him are Black, Protestant labor union and Jewish community leaders, including Rabbi Joachim Prinz, then president of the American Jewish Congress, who was on of the speakers at the March.

This is the second publication by the Anti-Defamation League, a Jewish human rights group, of "The Record." The first was an education supplement on the Holocaust, distributed in conjunction with NBC-TV's series, "Holocaust."

The new project, a spokesman for the Jewish organization said, was undertaken to enhance alliances in the community and to further intergroup understanding and cooperation.

Charles R. Campbell, editor and co-publisher of the Arizona Informant Newspaper, has written a book on how to obtain a college degree with little or no classroom attendance. Dress For Less

You don't have to lose your shirt paying for your family's clothing, if you know how to shop smartly and stop some things that could drive up the cost of clothes.

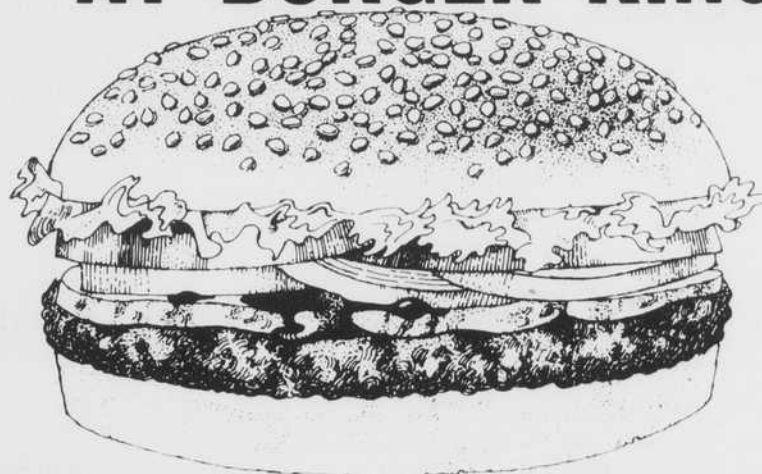


To get your money's worth from a garment, check the threads. They should be running straight. The sleeves should be set in correctly with the cross threads running straight and the lengthwise threads running down, not at angles.

The stitches should be firm and the buttonholes set in precisely in regard to the grain of the garment. Patterned clothes should be matched where pieces join: in the back center seam, side seam, armholes, where the edge of the collar rolls over and meets the coat or dress in the back, where the jacket buttons in front, and at the pocket openings.

A number of concerned congressmen are also trying to help keep you from paying more than you should for clothes. They are opposing a recently issued set of new regulations for the cotton industry that will cost that industry almost \$3 billion for new equipment. These costs could drive up clothing prices because of the estimated 17-24 cents increase in the cost of producing cotton fabric.
