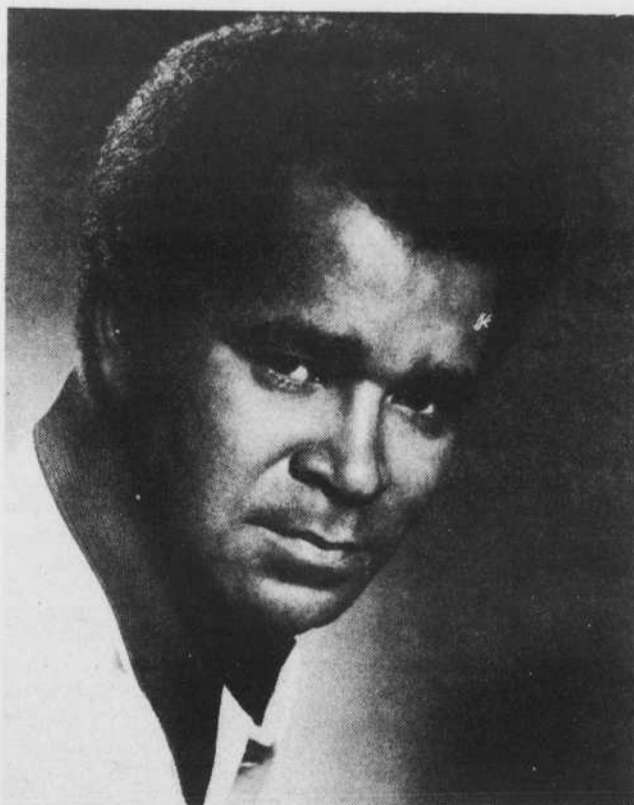

While attending the University of Iowa, Greg had his own radio show as a disc jockey on WSUI and also performed in radio dramas. He also wrote a jazz column for the Daily Iowan, founded the Modern Jazz Society and won the Northern Oratorical League competition at Northwestern University during his third year, while enrolled on a speech scholarship.

He agreed to appear at the early morning jazz concert to help foster local interest in jazz.

Then send one to each of your new friends with a note of appreciation for having had the opportunity to visit their homeland. Maybe they'll visit you someday?
