Corning Announces Voluntary Recall Program

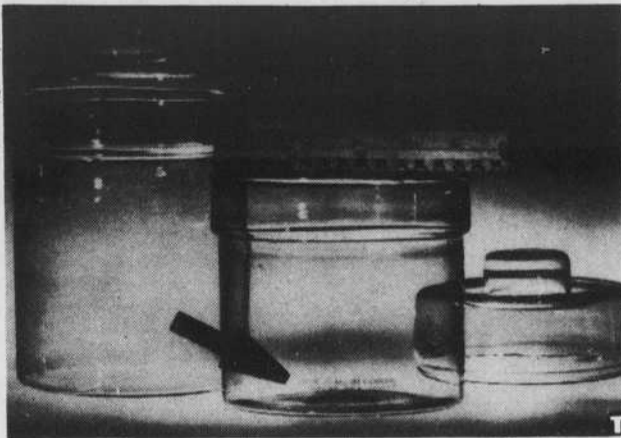
Corning Glass Works has announced a notification and voluntary recall program on three sizes of its Show-It-All decorative storage container because of a potential quality problem with the glass covers. A company spokesman explained that the cover on a small percentage of three of the six sizes of these clear glass containers may become stuck, and forced removal may cause breakage.

From 5,000 to 10,000 only of the 54,000 that may have reached consumers have this problem, the company estimated.

The company has notified the CPSC (Consumer Product Safety Commission) that the three items affected by this manufacturing problem are only the 1 Liter (//6210), 1.5 Liter (//6215), and 2.0 Liter (//6220) Show-It-All containers which have mouths with a five-inch diameter. The size of the container (1 Liter, 1.5 Liter or 2.0 Liter) can be found near the bottom edge of the glass container. The product numbers (6210, 6215 and 6220) are indicated on the packaging only.

These products were shipped to retailers in September.

Corning Glass Works has announced a notification and voluntary recall program on three sizes of its Show-It-All clear-glass storage containers because of a potential quality problem with the covers. Consumers can identify the three items affected by this manufacturing problem as the 1 Liter, 1.5 Liter and 2.0 Liter containers with mouths that measure five inches in diameter. The size of the container is located on the bottom edge of the containers (arrow). Retailers are being notified to provide replacements or refunds to customers.

Consumers who experience a problem with the covers lodging in the containers should return the entire item to the dealer. They should not attempt to remove the jammed covers. Retailers are currently being notified to provide replacements or refunds to customers who return such products.
