Mr. Franklin, is married to Debra Franklin, special Education teacher at Crestwood elementary school.

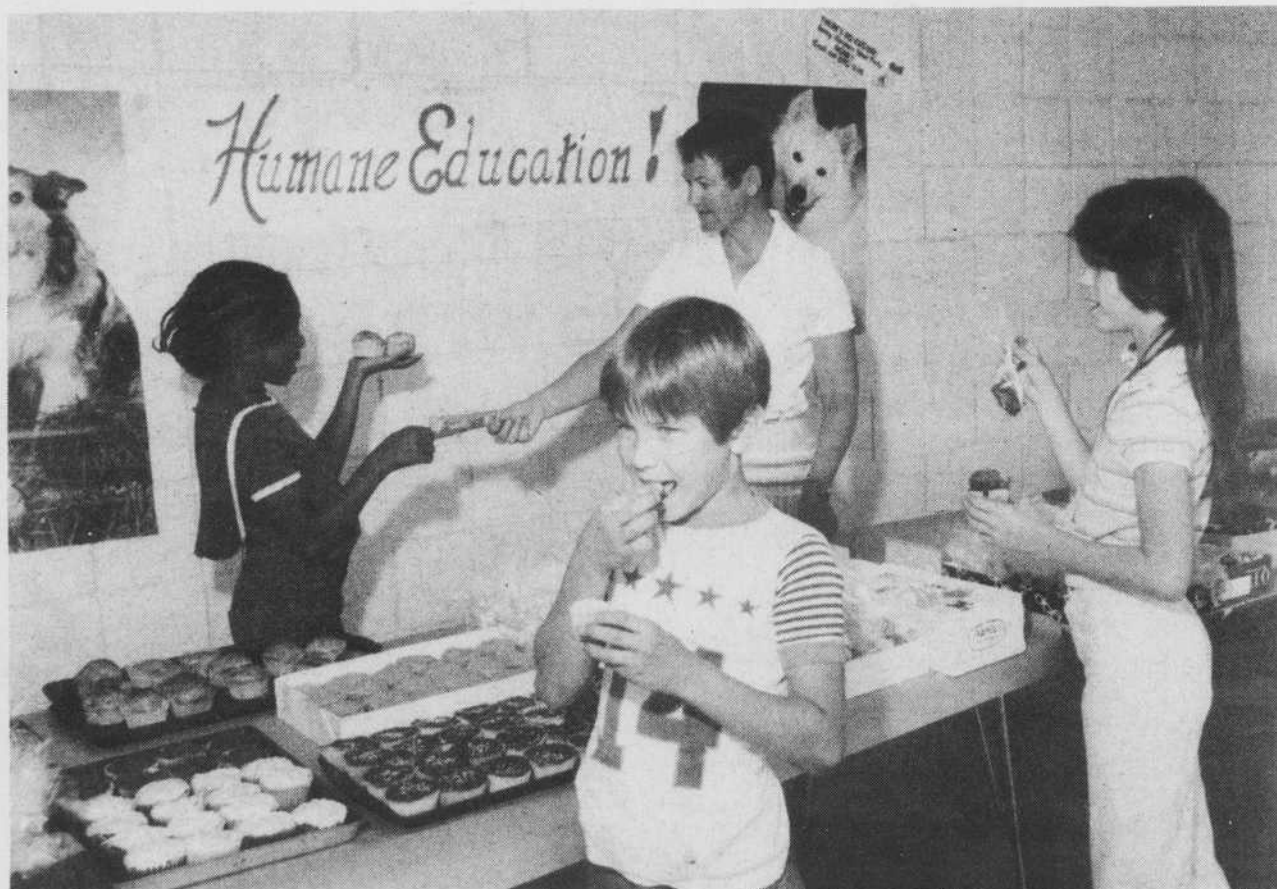
Major goal is to make Garside, one of the best Jr. High school in the nation. To assist all students to be successfully academically as well as socially, and to be the best Administrator, possible.
