
VICTORY BAPTIST CHURCH

GREAT MOMENTS IN GOSPEL GOSPEL SCENE By Rev. Sam Roberson, Religious KLAV and KCEP [FM] Radio

In the long and rich heritage of Black people, our music has been one of our greatest treasures. The music of Black people - in gospel singing, spirituals, jazz - and all our musical forms is meaningful in many ways. We, as Black people, have communicated by music the history of our people - our centuries of slavery, our struggle for freedom, our bold and profound assertion of ourselves as a people.

As Black people, we discover ourselves in our music. We take comfort in it today and in yesteryear. We cried out, musically, of our agonies, love, sorrows, joys, and our indomitable spirit. Black people created the only authentic, original musical tradition in America.

Dorsey's gospel, "good news, good music, a good heart" was aimed to lift the spirits of poor Blacks during the depression. It wound up inspiring a generation of singers who might easily have conquered jazz or blues, but, like Mahalia Jackso who succeeded Sallie Martin as Dorsey's chorister, they preferred sticking with "the Lord's despised few."

Lord's despised few." This year, the Co-ordinating Committee for Great Moments in Gospel planned a three day activity with Rev. Sam Roberson. Friday, August 31 was designated for competition of soloists, groups, choirs, musicians, etc. Saturday, September 1 was set aside for an Awards Banquet, and Sunday September 2 for a Gospel Music Festival. We report that all events were well attended. Participants for Friday night's competition were Ms. Lin-da Moore, 1st place in female soloists; Ms. Dallene Can-ty, 2nd place, and Ms. Francis Major, 3rd place. Male soloist winner was Rev. T. L. Seal. Best female group was Angels of Iov and in the best mixed group category. Angels of Joy and in the best mixed group was Voices of Praise emerged the Victor.

Saturday night, we awarded Mrs. Emily Mead from Pleasant Grove Baptist Church and Mr. William "Jr." Parker from St. James Baptist Church. Sunday afternoon [3:00 p.m.] we crowned, for the second time, Ms. Jerene [3:00 p.m.] we crowned, for the second time, Ms. Jerene Jenson as Queen for Great Moments in Gospel, 1979-1980. We also acknowledged Mr. Tony Wright of Penecostal Temple for his contribution to Gospel Music and Ms. Loyce Hall for her contribution to Gospel Music throughout the State of Nevada.
