Human Relations Office Serves Black Citizens

The Human Relations Office of the Clark County School District is a part of the Department of Pupil Personnel Services, and was organized to coordinate the school and community relations programs and to facilitate multicultural education and human relations in the District.

The office assists administrations of the sixth grade centers, secondary schools and Opportunity School in contacting and communicating with parents. It keeps the community informed of positive developments as they relate to intergroup harmony between students and staff and assists schools in developing worthwhile programs affecting minority students. Mr. Brown also encourages other agencies to promote multicultural education in cooperation with the District.

Most of the projects evolve from the request of the students for desirable changes in the conduct of school affairs and for encouragement of

the involvement of all students. All projects receive administration approval before being implemented.

A trained staff of 16 persons (Human Relations Workers) headed by the Coordinator, Al Brown, who joined the School District Staff in the Fall of 1971, promote the programs by making home visitations, solving problems, encouraging student involvement, providing counseling sessions for problems affecting the student's progress in

school and detecting the non-involvement of minority groups in school activities so they can be encouraged to get involved.

The staff workers are valuable in that they are available to make contact with parents at all hours and at critical times when immediate contact is necessary. This phase of the program makes the task of the worker difficult.

Students are encouraged to use the services offered by the Human Relations Office instead of trying to solve difficulties by themselves. The office number is 736-5480.
