REDD FOXX'S HOME HIT BY VANDALS!

On Monday night the beautiful tree-lined home of comedian Redd Foxx was vandalized, causing considerable damage to the recently remodeled structure. The decorative white stone walls of the house were smeared with spray painted obscenities and the letters "K K K."

An anonymous phone call received by a member of the household staff indicated that the Klu Klux Klan was responsible for the vandalism. Preston, long-time friend, caretaker and spokesman for Foxx, indicated that the incident was apparently related to a

situation of several months ago, in which Redd Foxx allegedly made a pass at a white teenage waitress in a restaurant and then verbally abused her when she rebuffed him. The girl's parents pressed charges against Redd. The ensuing trial, held several weeks ago,

was dismissed when Redd apologized to the girl.

The housekeeper who received the anonymous phone call related that the caller said the Klu Klux Klan was acting in retaliation for Foxx's treatment of the girl and the subsequent dismissal

of the trial.

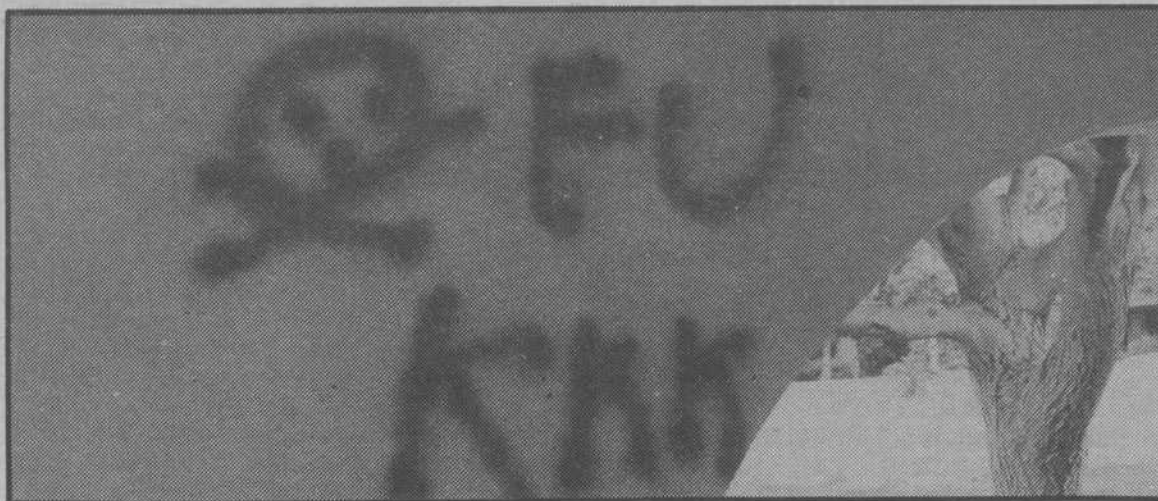
