



Rev. Dunn Speaks Out

This is the second in a series of articles relating to a recent SENTINEL interview with Rev. Albert Dunn, pastor of the Allen Chapel AME Church. This series will conclude in next week's

The SENTINEL asked Rev. Dunn: "What can be done to eliminate what was experienced last time or during previous years where there were a lot of Black candidates running for city and county offices and as such diluted the number of votes needed to get someone in office?"

DUNN: "If you have voter education along with your voter registration and political education, you will then develop an intelligent constituency. They then will, in fact, elect the kind of qualified leadership that we will need. There's a simple statement we used to hear for years - 'You can't teach what you don't know.' When people have knowledge of the candidates they will then elect the kind of leadership that can provide light, advancement and progress needed in the community. If this is done, you will get the caliber of candidate that will be needed in the community."

SENTINEL: "Has there ever been an effort made. in the past, to get the Black candidates together in a public debate or forum before the public so that they would be able to make a better judgement or assessment as to who would do a better job?"

DUNN: "Well, I have never seen it done in Las Vegas. We used to do it in Atlanta, Georgia. There we had the All-Citizens Voter Registration Committee, better known as the Neighborhood Voter Registration Committee. They went from block to block registering people to vote. They also had a night where people taught how to use the voting machines. They also dealt with the knowledge of the office where it was revealed what was expected of a candidate of a particular office. I've never seen anything like this done here."

SENTINEL: "Can it be done here?"
