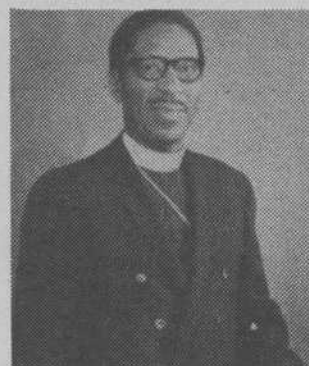

DUNN: "Certainly! It can be accomplished if a responsible organization would be able to sponsor it. There are some organizations here who could possible handle it. I can think of the NAACP, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference if they were active, or a new group. The Ministerial Alliance could become involved if the mentality and knowledge of the process was there. Any responsible group could set it up. As a matter of fact, they would get the cooperation of all prospective candidates because it would be to their advantage to be present and come out and participate in that teaching process. So it's highly possible."
