

# NAACP: Otis Is Mistaken If He Thinks We Are Out To Get Him

A spokesman for the local office of the NAACP said earlier in the week there is absolutely no truth to the statement made by Otis Harris last week that the NAACP is responsible for a petition allegedly being circulated which calls for the ouster of Harris as head of the Southern Nevada Economic Development Council.

NAACP Executive Director Alice Key said that NAACP President, Dr. James B. McMillan is out of the city but she had been directed by members of the executive committee to issue a press release denying Harris' allegation. Miss

Key said the NAACP chapter takes no action without executive committee approval; and that Mr. Harris as a former board member should know that. She also said that Marjorie Elliott, who is SNEDC Board Chairman was present at the last executive meeting and knows that there was not even a mention of a petition.

"A week later," Key said, "at the General Membership meeting there was some discussion about an insulting letter written to Mrs. Lubertha Johnson by Harris, but no action was taken." Key said there was angry criticism of

Harris' conduct and there was some speculation as to the reason for his recent conduct, but the consensus of opinion was that the NAACP has its hands full taking care of NAACP business and Otis Harris should be left to his own fate or to whomever he is accountable.

"I'm glad to note that the NAACP wants to be responsible for community development and is not going to be a part of destroying community efforts. I like to see that," said Otis Harris, responding to this NAACP statement. "I am pleased. It looks like maybe we can have a unified community after all."
