

Here's Another Chance

Did The Census Takers Miss You?

Were you counted in the 1980 Census of Population and Housing?

If you think you or your family might have been missed, fill out the WERE YOU COUNTED? form being printed in newspapers as a public service. Cut it out and mail it to the address shown on the form. It will be checked against the master address list for your area so there is no chance of an individual or household being counted twice.

The appeal is made by BEVERLY CARLINO, Manager of the census district office for this area who says that the "Were You Counted?" campaign is the final phase of the 1980 census. It is conducted to insure that no one is overlooked.

A few days before April 1, Census Day, questionnaires were mailed to all residential addresses in the area. They were to be filled out and mailed back on April 1. After about two weeks, the Census Bureau hired and trained local residents as census takers and sent them out to call at homes from which no questionnaires had been received. They also had to contact, usually by telephone, households which had returned inadequately filled-out questionnaires.

questionnaire for every household has been completed," the manager said, "and shortly we will be able to turn over to local officials the population counts for their communities." Known as the Local Review Program of the census, its purpose is to give local government officials an opportunity to spot errors while census

workers are still in the field; thus, contributing significantly to the accuracy and success of the census.

"We're already in the process of adding up the figures, but of course, the totals will be unofficial, preliminary counts. The official counts will come sometime later from the Director of the Census Bureau."

The manager pointed out that representation in the U.S. Congress and the State Legislature is determined by census population count. Federal funds are allotted to States and local governments on a per capita

basis. So a short count means under representation in the law-making bodies and under allotment in government funds. Thus it is imperative that we have a complete count. The help of every resident of the area is needed to reach this goal, he said.

Energy Crisis Program

The Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County is again accepting applications for the Energy Crisis Assistance Program. Poverty-level guidelines have recently been increased and persons who were not previously eligible may now qualify for assistance.

If you meet the new guidelines (a single person household may now make up to \$4,738 annually; a four-member household up to \$9,313) a \$200 payment will be made toward your Utility Bill.
