

Assemblyman Bennett Seeking Re-Election

Assemblyman Marion Bennett, chairman of the Health and Welfare Committee, announced today he will seek reelection to the Assembly District 6 seat he has held since 1972.

Bennett, during his freshman term in 1973, was named chairman of the Health and Welfare Committee. He chaired the committee again in 1975, was vice chairman

in 1977, and chairman again in 1979.

During the 1979 session, the Las Vegas democrat also served on the Commerce Committee and the Labor and Management Committee.

Bennett, the pastor of Zion United Methodist Church since 1960, was chairman of the special committee on Tourism and Economic Development in 1977. He has also

served on the Legislative Functions Committee.

He successfully worked for a landlord-tenant bill and day care centers for low income working mothers during past session of the legislature, as well as for funds for increased economic development. During the 1979 session, he conducted hearings and was the principal floor spokesman on successful

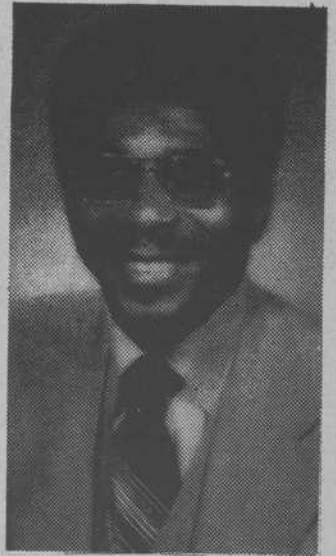
legislation to authorize in Nevada a hospice — a medical facility which treats terminal patients. A local committee currently is working on development of the Nate Adelson Memorial Hospice in Las Vegas.

Bennett said he will continue efforts to assist senior citizens with utility bills, support funds for preventive programs dealing with drug abuse,

and would support legislature requiring mandatory insurance coverage for treatment of alcohol and drug abuse.

Bennett presently is chairman of the Clark County Health Coalition. He serves on the Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County, is chairman of the board of the Nevada Economic Development Company, chairman of the Westside Development Commission, and serves with United Way.

He received the "Outstanding Young Man of America" award in 1971.

Voter Registration

The Clark County Election Department has established two satellite locations for Clark County residents to register to vote.

Citizens may register to vote at either the Boulevard Mall or the Meadows Mall between 11 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Registration booths will be open through August 9, the deadline for registration for the Sept. 9 primary election. The booths will not be open July 4.

In addition to these locations, residents may register to vote at the Clark County Elections

Department, 400 Las Vegas Blvd. So., North Las Vegas City Clerk's Office, North Las Vegas Library, Henderson City Clerk's Office, Boulder City Clerk's Office, Boulder City Library, Boulder City Library, Democratic headquarters, or Republican headquarters.

There are also registration points set up by the NAACP office: Super Markets in North Las Vegas and West Las Vegas to include Smith's Food King, Safeway and Thrifty Mart plus the Brother's Market in the Twin Lakes Shopping Center.
