Dorothy M. Walker, a 34 year resident of the Las Vegas area, has joined the race for the seat representing Assembly District 7 in North Las Vegas.

Among concerns she said she would like to

Bennett Youth Program Gets Federal Grant

The Marion Bennett Youth Program project, suspended two months ago for alleged violations of its \$140,000 federal grant, will resume operations, a spokesman recently reported.

The project is funded by the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) and CETA Executive Director Ernest Bryant said as part of a "unique" overhaul of the project Jim Chaney has been appointed to oversee the spending of all CETA funds by the MBYP.

Under its new design, "there will be more ac-

countability" and the program's staff will have maximum control. The program has \$92,000 of its original grant left, Bryant said.

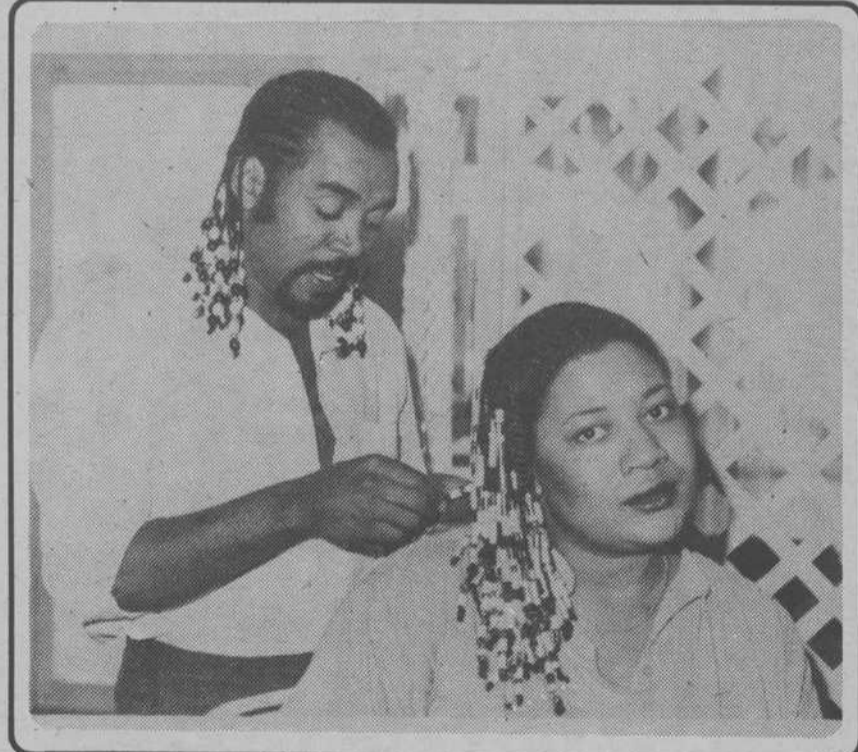
Chaney, coordinator of the MBYP, will be paid for his services in the full-time position, Bryant said, but a salary has not been worked out.

Bryant said the program's staff had "worked diligently to straighten" out the problems with the project. CETA cut off funding of the MBYP's Youth Community Conservation and Improvement. Project in

April after discovering the program allegedly had been weatherizing empty houses in the predominantly black community of West Las Vegas.

Federal law required the project to weatherize the homes of persons 125 percent below the poverty level.
