

Virginia Brewster Runs For 2nd Trustee Term

Clark County school trustee Virginia Brooks Brewster has filed for reelection in District C.

Seeking a second four-year term, Brewster, 42, said she is "greatly concerned about being able to offer the same quality education for fewer dollars" in the coming years because of the federal and state financial cuts the school district now is having to endure.

She believes Clark County students are receiving a quality education, and said the recent test results show students fare well on the national average.

One thing she would like to see accomplished in the coming years is a mandated foreign language requirement for students before they graduate.

Brewster said she has pushed for that requirement before, and will continue to do so if re-elected.

The co-chairman of the vocational — technical education committee, Brewster was one of those responsible for gaining

passage of a \$3.3 million new vocational center which will be open to students the fall of 1982.

Referring to her past four years, Brewster said she has helped accomplish the reduction of class size at the Junior high level, upgrade secondary school libraries and expand special education classes for handicapped students.

She also lists as one of her accomplishments the

16 percent increase in the textbook and instructional supply account.

Brewster is married and the mother of two children. Her husband, Willie, is employed by Longley Construction Co. They reside at 329 Fredrick Ave.

She is employed by the State of Nevada in its Consumer Affairs Division.

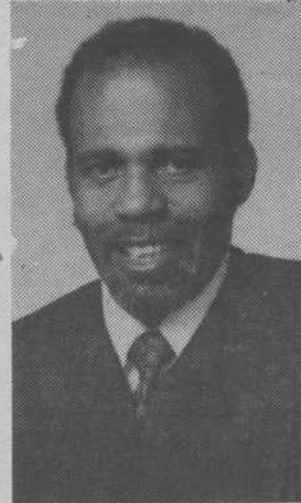
In the last election, Trustee Brewster ran against Jimmy Gay.

Earle White Seeks To Remain Peace Justice

Justice of the Peace Earle W. White, Jr. announced today that he will seek election to the Department Five seat he currently holds.

White, 47, a Las Vegas attorney since 1964, was appointed to the bench by the Clark County Commission in June to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Al Becker.

A native of New York City, White has served as a Clark County Deputy Public Defender, legal advisor and special appeals officer of the Nevada Industrial Commission, alternate referee for the Juvenile Department of the Eighth District Court and coroner's inquest hearing

assistant and attorney for the U.S. Housing and Home Finance Agency (now the Department of Housing and Urban Development) in Washington, D.C. in 1963 and 1964.

As a magna cum laude graduate of Howard, White served as editor in chief of the Howard Law Journal, was captain of the National Moot Court Team, was recipient for a research fellowship and full tuition scholarship and won 10 Bancroft-Whitney prizes in various segments of law education.
