BankAmerica Corporation was the first company that MD&Co. approached. One of the firm's partners contacted Barbara Muselli, Bank of America's Minority Purchasing Officer, who is also a member of the Bay Area Purchasing Council. She arranged a meeting with the bank's chief auditor, Cameron

Jarrett.
"Because of our size, we recognized that we will never be the principal auditors for Bank America or General Motors," said Morris, "but, everyone of those organizations has a number of smaller jobs that we can do

very effectively.

Morris said that minority-owned businesses make up almost four percent of all the businesses in the nation, yet they con-tribute less than one percent of the revenues. And, since the large corporations control the purse strings -- and at times they do not appear to be too anxious to open than -- It's difficult not to let that feeling creep up, he said.

The positive reaction they received from both BankAmerica and Ernst & Whinney was not quite what they expected. "We were kind of surprised, but quite pleased," said Morris "They were extremely receptive."
