Local NAACP Youth Council Cited Best

Lee Walker was recently elected chairman of the business sector of the Economic Opportunity Board. The EOB is comprised of 33 members-11 from the public sector, 11 from the disadvantaged sector and 11 from the business sector.

The EOB administers about \$6 million annually, serving more than 5000 Clark County residents in programs designed to aid young, handicapped and disadvantaged people.

The Youth Council of the local chapter, NAACP, has been named the most outstanding among the national agency's 1,700 chapters, according to Alice Key, executive director for the local agency. She said "the award was for outstanding achievement in all activities in 1979-80."

"We were completely surprised," recounted Key. "A young man called up and identified himself as president of the Los Angeles NAACP college division. He said he had an award for the Las Vegas chapter as recognition for the outstanding work of the

Youth Council.

"We're delighted naturally," Key said. "The whole NAACP premise is that youths are our future. We are proud of our youngsters who worked diligently in this year's programs."

The council's programs included a tribute to Nevada's first black teacher, Mabel Hoggard: a tutoring program for high school students; raising funds for the agency's scholarship fund, and winning seven first-place awards at the recent youth fair at the Las Vegas Convention Center, Key said.
