

Assemblyman Price Seeks Re-election

Assemblyman Bob Price, chairman of the Taxation Committee, has filed for re-election to his fourth term representing District 17.

The North Las Vegas Democrat chaired the

powerful Taxation Committee during the 1979 legislative session. The committee helped develop the tax slashing package which returned \$245 million — a full one-third of Nevada's two-year state budget — to the people in the form of

tax reductions.

Price, who was first elected in 1974, said one of his legislative priorities will be legislation authorizing the compensation of victims of crime. He has sponsored such

legislation during the last two sessions. The Price proposal would place an additional fine on any person convicted of a gross misdemeanor or felony, with the money earmarked for a fund to help compensate crime victims.

Price, 44, has served on the Judiciary, Commerce, Agriculture and Environment and Public Resources Committees during his three terms in the legislature, besides chairing the Taxation Committee.

Jack Petitti Files For Eighth Term

Petitti who has been particularly active in county government

throughout the years, has served at various times as Chairman of the Board of Com-

missioners, member of the Las Vegas Convention/Visitors Authority, and Clark County Liquor and Gaming Commission.

Petitti has also been active throughout the years in sponsoring youth programs and activities, pointing to them as areas that need continued strong support at the County Commission level.

He and his wife, Georganna, live at 1828 Hoover Street in North Las Vegas.
