## Paul May Seeking Re-Election

Speaker of Assembly Paul May announced today he will seek reelection to the North Las Vegas Assembly seat he has held for 14 years.

May, 52, ranks second among Nevada's 40 assemblymen seniority. He was first elected in 1966.

Elected by his fellow Democratic assemblyman to the powerful position of Speaker in 1979, May presided over the last legislative session in the Assembly's top leadership

"I was thrilled and humbled by being elected Speaker," May said. "The responsibilities of the job were many and varied, and I spent the session

working as hard and well as I could to meet the challenges of the speakership."

May said, however, that he would not seek the position again for the legislative session beginning in January.

"The Nevada Assembly is extremely fortunate to have a number of outstanding, respected and experienced leaders," May said. "We have many men and women thoroughly prepared to assume the leadership efforts to impose an inheritance tax in Nevada. "The last major battle was during the 1977 session," May said.

"The inheritance tax measure passed the Senate but after a lengthy and sometime bitter battle, we killed it in the committee."

May said challenges facing the 1981 legislature would include reapportionment, dealing with the problems of rapid growth and development, transportation and roads, criminal justice "and a possible threat to possible uncertain and


