WHAT IS AN ASSEMBLYMAN?
TERM: Two years.
SALARY: \$80 per day not to exceed \$4800 in Regular Session and \$1600 in Special Session.
QUALIFICATIONS: 21 years of age, resident-citizen for one year preceding election, residence in the district he or she represents.
DUTIES: Have the responsibility of enacting the laws which govern the people of Nevada, including determining the need for new sources of revenue, enacting same into law and approving disbursements of state money through the state budget. Convene in January of each odd-numbered year and at the call of the Governor.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION

1. Must be 18 years old and a citizen of U.S.A.
2. Resident of Clark County for 30 days and precinct for 10 days prior to November 7, 1978.

September 12: Primary Election
October 7, 9:00 P.M.: Registration closes
October 31: Last day to request Absentee Ballot
November 7: Election Day
