"The chicken I prepare has them coming back time and time again for my special sauce and personal touch," Green added.

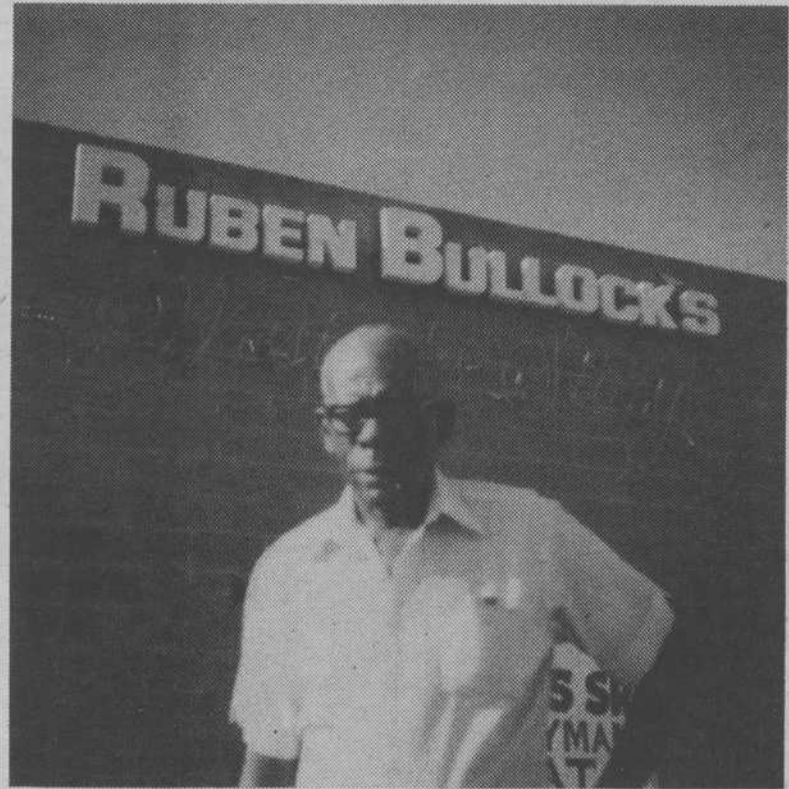

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range. For the most part they provide only summer employment. In driving around the community during the summer months, I have observed students engaged in cleanup or grass cutting operations. All of the jobs are not "outside" jobs. I have observed a large number of Black youths engaged in the "outside" activities. White youths seem to have a "hold" on the inside-air-conditioned jobs.

The importance of youth employment is great. There are

profound impacts on the family. In Black families the average income, in Las Vegas, is only slightly higher than half that of white families. Those family incomes are determined by the combined incomes of both mother and father. When the children are also employed, it could mean, if there are two employed children, an additional \$10,000 yearly income. The difference then, between white and black incomes, becomes intolerable.

The depression, which America feels will occur with continuing inflationary trends, has already occurred with Blacks. Actually, Blacks have been in a constant state of depression since

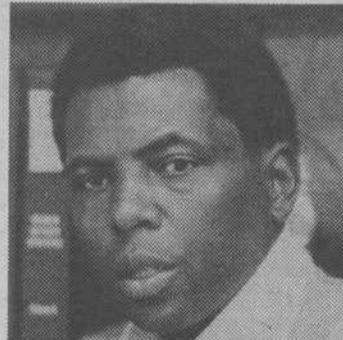
the end of the Civil War and part of the cause is the high unemployment rate among Black youth.

Las Vegas has not addressed this problem sufficiently: In the entertainment industry we observed the limited number of black youth employed. As new hotels open, new jobs are created but, Blacks continue to be unemployed. Something has to be done. One of our greatest natural resources, black youth, is being wasted.

It is time to cease paying lip service and get on the stick. Some are growing less willing to continue to do without. As Baretta says: "You got the ball..."
