Woman Held For Murder

Last Sunday a 36 year old Las Vegas woman was held in the Clark County Jail on an open murder charge in connection with the death of Lealthur Jones, 46, whose body had been found in a vacant lot in West Las Vegas early Saturday, Metro police reported.

Jones, 428 Van Buren Ave., had apparently been stabbed to death, police said.

Police said Anne Lee Carter was identified as the suspect. They said the woman was questioned several hours after Jones died and then was booked in jail.

Jones' body was found at 1:14 a.m. in a pool of blood near 711 N. "C" St.
