A recent tally conducted by the Clark cocktail lounge. **County Business license** department for taxing and licensing purposes shows there are 36,400 motel and hotel rooms in time of this report with use in Clark County.

According to David Crosby, an analyst with 32, address unknown, the business license department, there are 37 resort hotels in the county and 121 motels.

A hotel is a facility where lodging, meals, entertainment and various personal services are provided, while a motel is usually less than 150 rooms and lacks extensive services.

The count showed that there are 26,693 hotel rooms and 9,707 motel rooms, Crosby said.

Another 323 rooms are under construction by the Hacienda Hotel and the Riverside Hotel and Casino in Laughlin, robbed First Western Crosby added.

The room count, conducted annually by the business license department, is used to determine and collect licensing fees and taxes.

Once prevailing at-


titudes are overcome, Latino said the relationship would become one of "working side by side with people rather than men and women."
