Counseling For Vietnam Veterans

Las Vegas' first counseling center for Vietnam-era veterans with readjustment problems is now operating at full scales at the Vietnam Veteran Center located at 214 S. 8th Street in Las Vegas. The Las Vegas Vietnam Veteran Outreach Program is part of an 87 team network created by the Veterans Health Care Act of 1979. The program is a new effort by the Veterans Administration to address the unique difficulties faced by the nation's forgotten warriors.

The Vietnam war was a long, costly and unpopular struggle which took the lives of 57,000 Americans. But, for many of the 2.8 million soliders who survived, the battle continues at home against public apathy, unemployment, alcohol, drugs. prejudice and alienation. Faced with rejection by America, many veterans withdrew and have never really attained a place in their society.

Vietnam veterans, as compared to past returning warriors, received almost no support from the American citizen and

only nominal attention from the government in making their adjustment to civilian life. The rationale was that the war was bad and should be forgotten, thus the veterans were bad and should be forgotten. The media promoted this myth, leaders confirmed it and the public accepted it.

The Vietnam Veteran Outreach Program is attempting to not only assist the veteran in understanding his ex-perience, but is also hoping to educate the public as to their responsibility in the war effort. Moreover, the program is designed to focus on the veteran as well as those who share his life. The aid offered is hassle-free - devoid of traditional bureaucratic red tape. The primary services available are:

Readjustment counseling

- Rap-groups

- Job counseling Information referral for V.A. benefits and community resour-

Agent Orange information.

 Discharge upgrade information

The Vet Center is a house in downtown Las Vegas which is staffed weekdays from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. However, there are team members available to response to the needs of veterans and their families in their homes or other community settings.

The team is made up of four Vietnam-era veterans. The team leader is Kerry Merback who served with the Air Force during the Vietnam-era. Kerry has a masters degree in Social Work and has been employed by the V.A. for the past five years as a psychiatric social worker. During this time he developed a special interest in the difficulties faced by Vietnam veterans.

James Emmett served in Vietnam as a helicopter crew chief and was the recipient of the Silver Star. Jim has worked in the field of psychiatric counseling for the past four years and recently earned a masters degree in 20th American Century Social History.
