does "one of the most terrible diseases — "amnesia."

"My dad always drilled it in my head to never get 'amnesia,'" King said. "I always go back to the same neighborhood in Cleveland to spend time with the friends I'll never forget."

King said too many people "forget they grew up in the ghetto. You've got to remember that it's a lot harder going down the ladder than going up — and you meet the same people going the other way now.

"If I could give any advice to young people coming up," he said, "it is this: Never forget where you came from."
