of the idiosyncrasies of someone in the caucus, to the point that a visitor would have concluded that the most urgent concern of blacks is music — especially Gladys Knight singing "I Will Survive," a powerful glorifier of divorce and/or separation, but a pitiful commentary on a dinner billed as "A Salute To The Black Family."

Congressional The Caucus had Black historic opportunities to do two things: first, fire blacks to the realization that their well-being rests on elections that will determine who is the next president, dominates our highest court, who holds the other levers of power; and, second, to use the media to halt or reverse resurgent racism — that is, to make white Americans understand that the nation's future is at stake in a world of warfare in the Persian Gulf area and Soviet adventurism Afghanistan and Africa,

and that under these circumstances the fate of white America is inseparable from that of 27 million black Americans.

Perhaps the Black Caucus affair has been expanded to the point where it is beyond management by its staff; the caucus may be taking in more money, but losing sight of old obligations and commitments to black America as a whole. It is not good for the caucus or the black community have black congressmen saying that their own dinner had

lost its purpose, or numerous blacks of consequence asking what the Black Caucus does with all the money it collects.

The caucus had an opportunity that comes only once every four years; it did not meet the challenge. There will be no presidential election next year, but there WILL be a caucus dinner, and that will not be too early for the black members of Congress to make some decisions as to whether thev are merely providing wine, music,
