The World Series **Of Billiards?**

HOUSTON - For the first time, the World Series will be entirely played in stadiums with artificial surfaces. Call this one the World Series of billiards.

As with almost every outdoor game, except perhaps tennis, baseball is meant to be played on God's grass, not on a chemist's carpet. On an artificial surface, baseball is unnatural. The ball bounces too quickly through the infield, the ball bounces too quickly and too high in the outfield. To compensate for these unnatural bounces, infielders and outfielders play deeper. On that flat, green carpet, a batter seems to resemble a pool hustler lining up a three-cushion shot. For this World Series, maybe the managers should be Willie Mosconi and Minnesota Fats.

The progressive argue that there are no bad hops on an artifical surface. Wrong. Hops that are too quick or too high on a carpet are just as bad as, if not worse than those that squirt crazily off grass or dirt.

At least a bad hop off grass or dirt has a natural charm to it, sometimes a historic charm. Back in the '60 World Series, the Yankees believed they lost the seventh game to the Pittsburgh Pirates

because a bad hop struck their shortstop, Tony Kubek in the throat. In his current role as a broadcaster for this World Series, a bad hop in the throat would put him on NBC's disabled list. But in 1960 only the World Series was at stake, not his voice. And that memorable bad hop was soon accepted as part of World Series lore.

In contrast, there is no charm to a ball that bounces unnaturally high off a chemist's carpet and an outfield fence for a ground-rule double that prevents a baserunner on first from scoring a run that might affect the World Series outcome.

But tomorrow night (Tuesday night, Oct. 14) the World Series of billiards began in Philadelphia, then transfer to Kansas City for the weekend games. As if the World Series is not already unnatural enough with its risk of cold October night games and the use of the designated hitter in alternate years, it's now about to be decided on a chemist's carpet.

The designated chemist entered baseball in 1965 when the Houston Astrodome opened as the world's first covered baseball stadium.

Muhammad Ali could face disciplinary action from the Nevada State Atheltic Commission because he took drugs before the required urinalysis after his Oct. 2 title fight with World Boxing Council heavyweight champion -Larry Holmes, commission chairman Sig Rogich said Tuesday.

But Rogich said he did not believe Ali's Nevada fight license should be revoked, a possible penalty under Nevada commission rules.

"I don't see a need to revoke his license," he said. "I just see a need to retire him, to let him go ut with a little dignity. I think he's been a great thing for the sport and I think that kind of consideration should be given."

The drugs were administered after the fight by Ali's physician, Dr. Charles Lee Williams,
