Caesars Says 'No Way'

Motorcycle daredevil Gary Wells, vowed last week to the news media that he would again attempt to jump the Caesars Palace fountains "one year" from the day of the first attempt." Wells was speaking from the Desert Springs Hospital, where he has been recuperating from injuries sustained in his attempt to jump the fountain.

Caesars Palace

executives have a different feeling about allowing Wells a second chance.

Wells feels differently. He believes Caesars would "go along with" a second jump, one he claimed he would make successfully. Harry Wald, Caesars executive vice president said, "We'd have to think twice about it."

Rebels Take 53-14 Win Over El Paso

LAS VEGAS, NEV. — Past the halfway marker in the 1980 season, it is becoming quite obvious that UNLV football has arrived on the major college level, in a very big and powerful way. Coach Tony Knap's record-setting Rebels are now 5-1 following a 53-14 triumph over the University of Texas-El Paso, and before UNLV is the greatest test in its 13-season history.

This Saturday afternoon, the explosive Rebels will attempt to challenge the University

of Oregon which is currently 2-2-2 after a 7-7 tie last Saturday with the no. 2-ranked University of Southern California.

While it is true that UNLV is rated offensively in the top 10 in the country in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense, the Rebels have not had to play a defense which is even remotely as close to being as good as Oregon's.

After the first six games of the 1980 season, UNLV is

averaging 459.0 yards per game in total offense, with 199.2 coming on the ground and 259.8 coming through the air. The Big Red Marching Machine is also scoring 39.5 points per game and averaging 6.4 yards per play.

On defense, UNLV's Big Red Rebel "D" is more than 100 percent improved over last season when UNLV finished 9-1-2. So far, the Big Red Rebel "D" is giving up 296.2 yards per game in total of-

fense (112.3 rushing and 183.8 passing) and allowing opponents an average of just 19.0 points per game.

Individually on offense for UNLV, senior quarterback Larry Gentry and senior flanker Sam Greene continue to etch themselves into the history and record books for UNLV football. Both among the national leaders in their respective positions, Gentry set two UNLV records and Greene added a tie of another one during the lopsided win.
