And although it's on Cheyenne and not Broadway, the Little Theatre at Clark County Community College promises an upcoming season filled with vibrant, live theater performances.

The exciting season line-up includes two

award winning dramas; a dynamic all black musical; and the rock musical phenomenon, "Hair."

Kicking off the 80/81 schedule is the New York Drama Critics award winning play, "Streamers," Oct. 23-25, and Oct. 30 - Nov. 1 at 8 p.m., with an additional matinee performance on Nov. 1 at 2 p.m.

Also appearing this season is the dynamic musical, "Don't Bother Me, I Can't Cope,"

directed by Steve McKenzie, and "That Championship Season," a powerful drama directed by Charles Supin.

The final production set for Spring will be "Hair" the musical that rocked Broadway, which will be played under the stars on the Cheyenne campus grounds.

"Hair" will be directed by Bob Dunkerly, cultural arts specialist and drama instructor at CCC

"Hair" will be choreographed by

Garold Gardner and the music will be under the direction of Jack Guinn.

Performing the rock musical outdoors on campus is one of two innovative steps introduced this season.

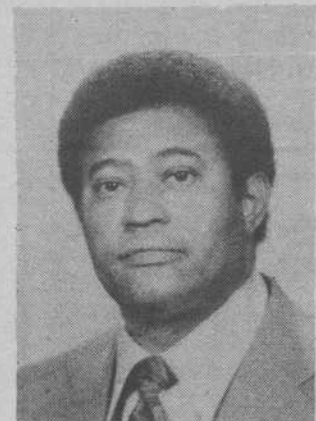
